

Responsive Reading Westminster Shorter Catechism, Q&A 45-48

Leader: What is the first commandment?

People: The first commandment is: You shall have no other gods before me.

Leader: What does the first commandments require?

People: The first commandment requires us to know and recognize God as the only true God and our God, and to worship and glorify Him accordingly.

Leader: What does the first commandment forbid?

People: The first commandment forbids denying God or not worshipping and glorifying Him as the true God and our God. It also forbids giving worship and glory, which He alone deserves, to anyone or anything else.

Leader: What are we specifically taught in the first commandment by the words 'before me'?

People: The words 'before me' in the first commandment teach us that God, who sees everything, notices and is very offended by the sin of having any other god.

Confession of Sin:

Almighty God, we acknowledge and confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed; we have not loved you with all of our heart, soul, mind, and strength; we have not loved our neighbor as ourselves. Deepen within us our sorrow for the wrong we have done, and the good we have left undone. Lord, you are full of compassion and gracious, slow to anger, and plenteous in mercy; there is always forgiveness with you! Restore to us the joy of your salvation; bind up that

which is broken, give light to our minds, strength to our wills, and rest to our souls. Speak to each of us, and let your word abide with us until it has wrought in us your holy will. Amen
