

Confession of Faith Athanasian Creed, Part 4

Whoever desires to be saved should above all hold to the catholic faith. Anyone who does not keep it whole and unbroken will doubtless perish eternally. Now this is the catholic faith: that we worship one God in Trinity and the Trinity in unity, neither confusing the persons nor dividing the essence...But it is necessary for eternal salvation that one also believe in the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ faithfully...He suffered for our salvation; he descended to hell; he arose from the dead on the third day; he ascended to heaven; he is seated at the Father's right hand; from there he will come to judge the living and the dead. At his coming all people will arise bodily and give an accounting of their own deeds. Those who have done good will enter eternal life, and those who have done evil will enter eternal fire. This is the catholic faith: that one cannot be saved without believing it firmly and faithfully.
